## Ricky's Hot Chicken

Ricky's, a fast-casual comfort food stop serving authentic Nashville-style hot chicken, opened this month. The menu includes chicken pieces, nuggets, sandwiches, fries, vinegar slaw and a side of the week, with chicken and waffles on weekends. The chicken is halal and free of peanuts and dairy. 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Owner and chef Ricky Tran said he was a mechanical engineer who opened the restaurant to “fill the Nashville hot chicken void in Dallas.”
